

What are the main barriers which prevent disabled people from accessing the things that everyone else takes for granted?

- **Lack of Physical Access**

Steps

Poor Lighting

Doors too narrow

Shiny surfaces

No accessible toilet

- **Lack of Access to Information**

Poor signage

Information not available in alternative formats

(Braille / large print / tape / symbols)

Standard information presented in a way that's not accessible to many people (tiny font and confusing colour contrasts)

No induction loop system

British Sign Language interpretation not available

- **Poor Attitudes Towards Disabled People**

Disabled people seen as a 'problem'

Lack of awareness of the Social Model and current thinking around disability issues

Complying with legislation whilst doing as little as possible

- **Organisational Barriers**

Policies that don't allow flexibility (e.g. Health and Safety policies / Home Visiting Policy)
