About Young K&C

We are a local charity, funded by John Lyon's Charity and RBKC, providing support to local community organisations across **Kensington and Chelsea**.

As a member-led organisation, we work with over 100 local community organisations supporting under 25s in Kensington and Chelsea. Our members can apply for small grants, receive high-quality training and benefit from 1-2-1 support to increase capacity in their organisations.


As local supplementary schools, we're here to help your capacity and development to provide support for children and young people across the borough.



Parent Carer Champion Network

Together with **The London Violence Reduction Unit** and **The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea (RBKC)**, funding is available to local voluntary organisations in Kensington and Chelsea to establish Parent Carer Champions Networks as early-intervention to increasing levels of Serious Youth Violence.

3 grants of £22,800 are available to organisations building community support networks between parents and carers. The approach aims to build on established community relationships, increasing knowledge and awareness of issues affecting high-risk young people through creative approaches










- Applications are open to providers and partners from across the Voluntary and Community Sector
 - Including Charities, CIC's, CIO's, Charitable Companies, Schools and Educations Settings
- You must be able to demonstrate established links within communities in Kensington and Chelsea as well as established network of parents
- You must recruit and train a minimum of 20 Parent Carer Champions for 3 months and sustain 15 Parent Carer Champions for 6 months
- You must identify and deliver a programme based on local needs

Making Space



In partnership with The Julia and Hans Rausing Trust and RBKC we are proud to announce this grant to increase the inclusion of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in play and youth settings.

Following consultation with SEND young people and their families, this grant responds to the needs of SEND young people. They need spaces in local play and youth settings to feel included and welcomed in sessions.

Applications are open to grants of £40,000 - the average application will be £20,000. We encourage applications of all sizes to apply for this grant







INCREASED ACTIVITIES

We want to see more opportunities and activities across the borough for children and young people with SEND. This includes specialist sessions but also adaptions to existing activities to increase inclusion across all levels.

INCREASED PARTICIPATON

There should be more children and young people with SEND attending specialist and regular session. They should feel welcomed and included in sessions and be given the same access to opportunities as young people without additional needs

INCREASED KNOWLEDGE

Staff should have knowledge of how to adapt sessions to be inclusive but also some developed knowledge on specialist needs and how to accomadate to young people. They should feel confident on including young people with additional needs.

Supplementary School Fund

The Lightbulb Trust are proudly supporting this grant to increase quality and capacity across the RBKC Supplementary Schools.

Grants of up to £4,000 are available to 10 organisations for core costs - to develop support for children and young people.

A large purpose of this grant is to improve quality. As part of this we will be working with **Westway Trust** and **YPF Trust** to create additional support through training to develop a **Quality Action Plan** and work towards the attainment of the **NRCSE Quality Mark**.





There's a total of £4,000 available to each applicant - we encourage you to split the cost and apply for a range of uses for the fund.



GRANT PANEL

We will assess applications at our grant panel alongside our funders and make decision in **August**

EVALUATION VISITS

Successful applicants may be visited by our panel to see the impact of the grants from **September**

Our Tips

5 W'S

Make your application really clear by talking about the 5 W's: Who, What, Where, When and Why
This helps us understand the function of our organisation

USE THE SUPPORT

Feel free to ask Young K&C or Westway Trust for help with this application if you have any questions or need any additional support

SPREAD THE COST

We do not recommend using the full cost (£4,000) for one thing, for example £4,000 on rent alone. We would recommend splitting the cost, for example £1,000 on rent, £2,000 on staff costs and £1,000 on policy development

CLEAR COST

Be really clear on the costs of what you're applying for: £11.95 per hour, 5 hours per week for 6 weeks for 3 staff members = £1,075.50



What are we looking for

- Clear explanations of your projects

 Be really clear about what your project is doing and how you plan to do it. Be sure to cover the 5 W's as you explain your project
- Address the needs of the young people you work with

 Use feedback and consultations that you've had with

 young people attending your sessions to guide your

 applications. We're here to champion young voices so

 want to fund projects they have expressed interest in

Be SMART with your outcomes

Don't feel the need to set unrealistic outcomes. We want them to be Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound

Make sure you use statistics to support your reasons for the project. You can use information from the feedback you've had from attendees, the National Indices of Deprivation, local reports such *Poverty and Prosperity in K+C*

Support what you say

- Capture feedback from staff, volunteers, young people and parents
- Tag Young K&C and the additional funders in any posts
