“Got me thinking more about the gains of disclosing domestic abuse rather than focusing on the barriers.”

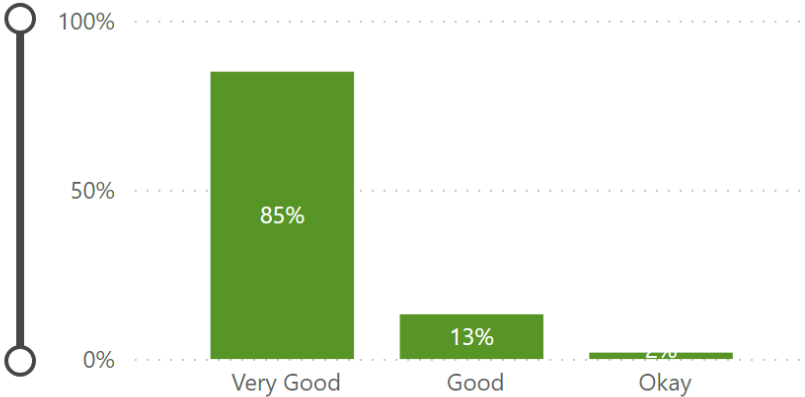
“Has changed the way I will view it from a third party perspective.”

We have completed projects with 12 charities so far.

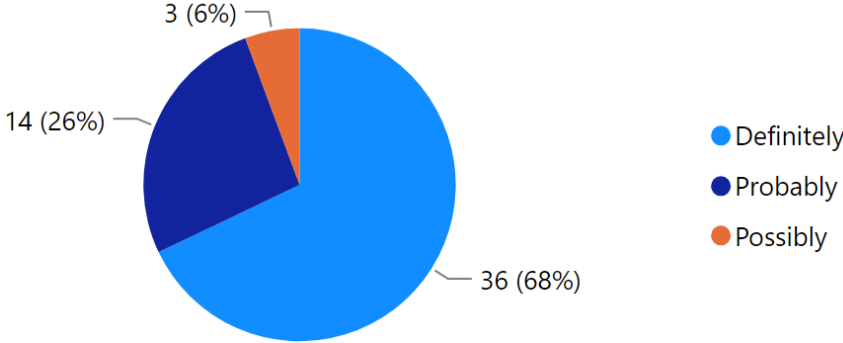
Our impact in RBKC



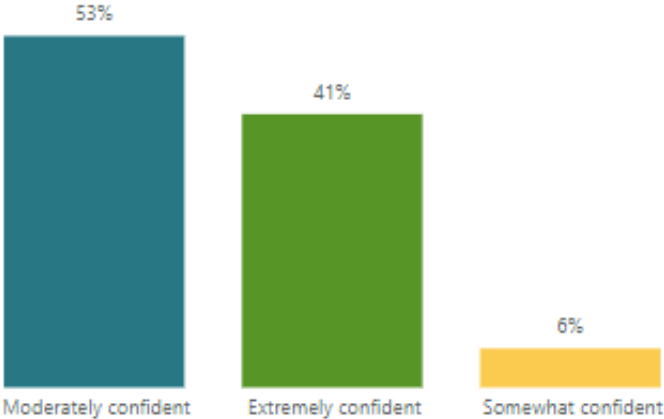
How did the workshop go?

Average rating of the workshop out of 5

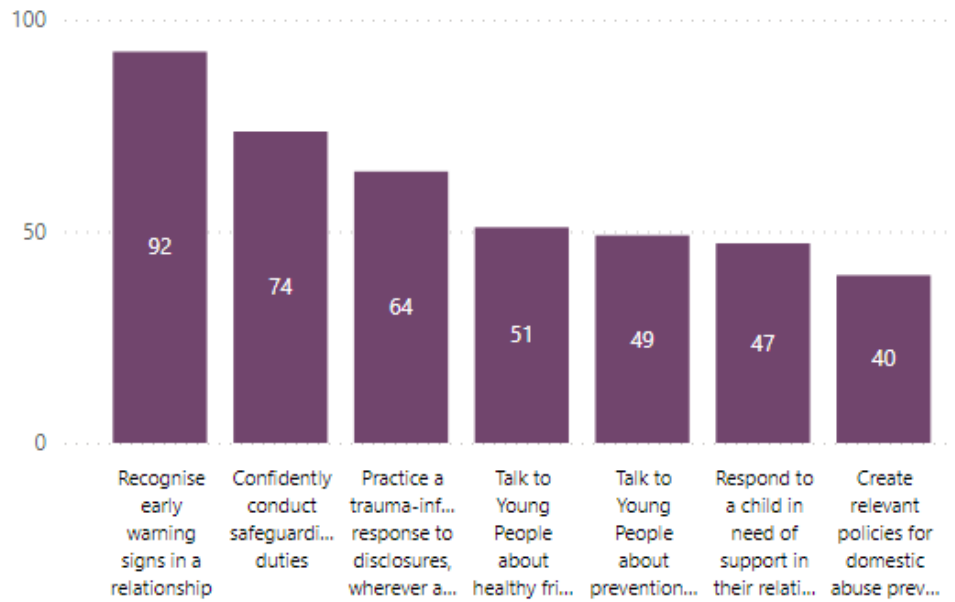


Will this improve children and young people's relationships?
68% said "Definitely".

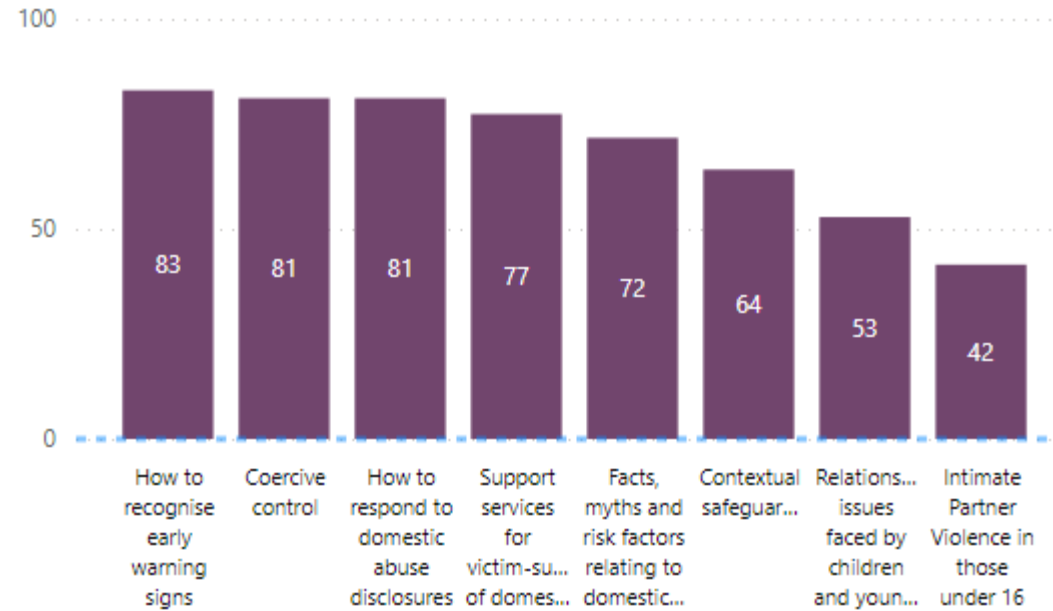


How confident are you to embed this learning within your setting?
41% said "Extremely confident".

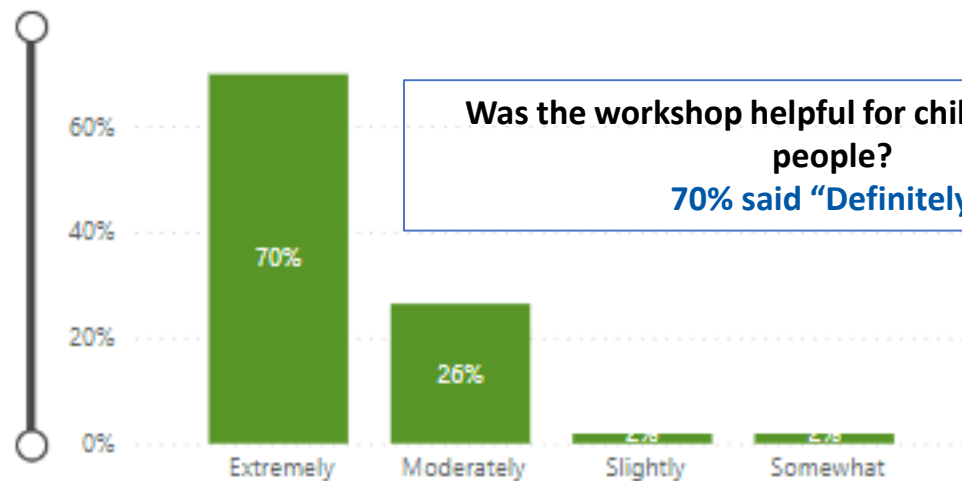




Change in skills as a result of the workshop?
 60% said their skills had improved in all areas suggested.



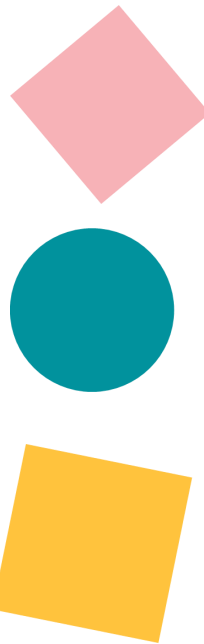
Change in awareness as a result of the workshop?
