Background

- October 2018 suspension of the Pembridge inpatient unit due to lack of consultant cover
- December 2018 independent review of palliative care services in RBKC, H&F, Westminster and Brent
- June 2019 Review published & made a number of recommendations on improvements for a future model of care
- September/October 2019 3 public workshops held focussing on;
 'Access, 'Care' & 'Aftercare & Bereavement'
 - Recruited volunteers for a Patient & Public Working Group
- November 2019 First Patient & Public Working Group meeting
