
## **Environment & Communities**

## **Financial challenges**

We have a balanced budget for 2021/22 but, for the three years that follow from 2022, the latest information shows a budget gap of £30m remains, which means making some tough choices about how best to deliver our priorities and achieve value from our finite resources.
