

Who are the LSCP?

Following the Children and Social Work Act 2017, the revised statutory guidance Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018 specified that all local areas had to publish the new multi-agency arrangements for safeguarding children to replace what were previously known as Local Safeguarding Boards.

What is the purpose of the LSCP?

The purpose of these arrangements is to support and enable local organisations and agencies to work together and ensure that:

- children are safeguarded, and their welfare promoted
- partner organisations and agencies collaborate to achieve improved outcomes for vulnerable children
- organisations and agencies challenge appropriately and hold one another to account effectively
- there is early identification of new safeguarding issues and emerging threats
- learning is promoted across the partnership
- information is shared effectively to safeguard children and families

What do the LSCP do?

- Provide multi-agency safeguarding training on a range of topics
- Offer advice and feedback on safeguarding policy and procedures
- Identify emerging safeguarding themes in the boroughs
- Our website lists safeguarding contacts and offers resources for children and young people, parents, carers and professionals
- Host events for children, young people and community organisations



Children & community engagement by the LSCP

- A link between children, young people, the community and the partnership
- Build an understanding of what it is like to live, attend school and spend time in the three boroughs
- Hear what's going well and what's not going so well
- Attend your forums, meetings and events
- Read and share your newsletters, resources and reports

- Uncertainty for children and young people about their education and future opportunities
- Anxiety about impact of COVID-19 on children, young people and their families' health
