Child Exploitation Operating Protocol 2021 webinar

This 1 hour webinar delivered by the child exploitation lead for RBKC, LSCP trainer and police, will provide an overview of the new [London Child Exploitation Operating Protocol 2021](#) and how the three boroughs will put it into practice.

This webinar will be particularly useful for practitioners working directly with children who are at risk of, or who are being exploited. For example social workers, police, health practitioners and youth services.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the webinar, participants will:

- have an overview of the new child exploitation protocol
- have an understanding of the local approach to tackling child exploitation
- have up to date referral pathways for child exploitation cases

This half-day workshop delivered by [Safeguarding Trainer and Consultant Rahana Hussain](#) is an important area of learning within the wider context of safeguarding children.

Disguised compliance' involves a parent or carer giving the appearance of co-operating with agencies to avoid raising suspicions to allay professional concerns, and ultimately to diffuse professional intervention.

By the end of the course participants will be able to:

- Develop a clearer understanding of the nature of disguised compliance and how it presents in the behaviour of the parent/carer;
- Explore tools and techniques that can be used to better intervene and work with the presenting dynamics;
- Understand how to keep the child at the heart of practice;
- Discuss the crucial role of reflective supervision;
- Examine learning from child safeguarding practice reviews and explore how theory can link to practice.

Parental Substance Misuse and the Impact on Children

This half-day workshop delivered by Turning Point is an important area of learning within the wider context of safeguarding children.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the workshop, participants will:

- Be able to identify the different types of drugs and their effects, both legal and illegal

- Understand why different people might use drugs
- Be able to identify the potential impact of parental use on children across a range of ages, including young carers
- Explore the cycle of change and how this may impact on an assessment
- Be able to identify sources of further support for parents and the professionals working with them
- Have greater clarity about the thresholds for safeguarding children
- Address your own attitudes and beliefs regarding parenting and substance misuse
- Develop an understanding of how to make an effective assessment with reference to the national assessment framework and identify good practice methods

Introduction to Children's Mental Health Support Teams (MHST)

This 1.5 hours introductory session and will be delivered by the Mental Health Support Team (MHST). The session is interactive and involves a combination of presentation, group discussion and video presentation.

It has been designed to increase awareness of the work of MHST in schools across LBHF, RBKC and WCC to help staff feel more informed about services available to address mental health needs of children and young people.

The session is open to any member of staff who would like to develop an understanding of available mental health support and feel more confident in providing signposting support to children, young people, and colleagues.

Learning outcomes:

- To understand the workforce's role in addressing mental health needs of children and young people;
- To identify ways in which we can be better equipped to deal with mental health needs of children and young people;
- To understand the difference between MHST and Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS), mental health tier systems and pathways to services
- Access relevant resources and other sources of support, and be able to provide appropriate signposting to children, young people and families.
