	RM announced that she will be leaving Octavia in early 2021 and will be stepping down as Chair of this meeting. RM was sad to be leaving but was please this created an opportunity for anyone interest to apply. A nomination form would be circulated at the end of the meeting.

2	Aliki Myrianidi, Dignity Champion Project Coordinator, to discuss Healthwatch Central West London's report on Care Home work during April to August 2020.	
	Aliki Myrianidi (AM) discussed a care home project carried out between April and August 2020 to see who care home managers were dealing with during the pandemic. A survey of 18 public funded care homes in RBKC and WCC were contacted 13 responded. Three residents, 5 relatives and 3 members staff agreed to take part in the survey.	
	Feedback: - Emotional stress and poor communication were noted between residents, relatives and staff Delayed testing for care home staff Staff requested more emotional support - Staff felt there was a lack of information on infection and arrangements made Staff felt that there was support for care homes from local Councils Relatives said they were unable to reach loved one even with the use of the app and iPads provided.	
	Lessons for the future:	
	 Emotional wellbeing support to staff Distribution of equipment to staff Better communication to relatives Support for communication between residents and relatives Care homes to have support and testing equipment required 	
	A phone line is being set up for relatives to continue to provide feedback to the team.

AM also provided an update on a survey carried out between July and December 2020 by Westminster colleagues that look at the experiences of people with respiratory illness during the pandemic. 75 responses were received in total.

Findings:

Digital exclusion – gap in skills to use digital services Visibility of services – 2/3 were not aware of options available Prescription medication – 10% experience trouble receiving medication

Jess Millwood, Age UK, Update on the RBKC Digital Inclusion project: No one Left Behind. This is an RBKC approach, although the Boroughs are working closely together on digital.

Jess Millwood (JM) explained that digital exclusion was previously an area of concern for older adults. It was during lockdown that the exacerbation of negative aspects such as loneliness, isolation and boredom for older people became apparent.

Age UK carried out a digital inclusion survey of 296 older people.

- 44% were found to be digitally excluded chiming with figures for the rest of the borough.
- Within the group those found to be digitally included struggled with internet issues and inability to access services.
- The positive and transformational effects of digital inclusion have also been noticed.

JM shared a short video highlighting the importance of being able to connect with people, see family, access appointments and shop on line for basic necessities.

Age UK Video

There is now a borough wide initiative to push forward digital access. The project is call 'Digital Inclusion Project – no one left behind'.

JM wished to acknowledge that there are groups that do not want to be digitally connected. There need to be other ways of connecting and supporting these groups.

Westminster are on board with this project. Westminster were ahead with the digital aspects which RBKC had to catch up with. This is lead by Tim Ellis who heads the IT department at RBKC. He is bringing in colleagues across RBKC, adults, children, social care services and the NHS, Healthwatch, Open Age and Age UK forming a community of interested people working across the borough. This is an attempt to highlight the work that is happening and try to get a coordinated approach.

Workstreams identified:

Understanding needs – Analysis of data, hotspots and connectivity cold spots, sheltered housing, understanding priority groups (older people, unemployed, families with children on free school meals).

Connectivity – RBKC are talking to big providers of wi-fi to negotiate widening reach, looking at innovation, accessible and effective bandwidth across the borough.

Access to Devices - Getting information about projects already happening in the borough. RBKC are looking at their collective buying power to use it to the best effect for the community.

Skills – What if you have never used the internet before? Looking at projects in place such as Open Age training programmes. How to support them to be comfortable with the appropriate equipment.

There will be a Voluntary Sector provider survey to gather what different organisations are doing and to get views around the different strands.

Any organisation is welcome to join. The group meet every week.

4 Elizabeth Dunsford, Senior Public Health Strategist – Adult Social Care, to give an update on situation with Covid-19 in both boroughs.

Presentation

Infection rates

- RBKC and Westminster rates are lower than London and England rates.
- The London overall rates have been dropping in West London but are still high in East London.
- The current Tier 3 discussion is due to what is happening with infection rates in the outer East London boroughs.

Messaging

- Continue to follow the public health measures

Testing

- PCR, for those with symptoms, there is plenty of availability for these tests.
- Lateral Flow Testing, for those without symptoms.
- The Council is piloting a strategy of the usefulness of these tests in the borough.

Vaccination

- Flu vaccine supplies have now been replenished.
- Everyone over 50 is now eligible.
- Covid-19 vaccine availability expected in early 2021.

Anca Giurgiu and Justine Dornan from RBKC Climate Change Team to discuss how older people can stay active and keep warm this winter.

Presentation

Anca Giurgiu (AG) Tackling fuel poverty is a key priority for the Council.

More people are working from home and an increase in fuel costs has been seen during the pandemic resulting in an increase in fuel poverty.

Homes4Health fuel poverty programme works with Groundwork's Green Doctors team to provides a free online service for households meeting key criteria.
