# SNB and Project Funding

- The Kensington & Chelsea SNB is set up and funded by the London Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC)
- Funds received from MOPAC are used to support small projects within RBKC targeting:
  - Crime Prevention;
  - Crime Reduction; and
  - Community Engagement
- For each of the last 4 years the K&C SNB has been allocated £23,670

# Project Funding

- Applications are sought from entities:
  - working within RBKC and/or London-wide
  - who have the expertise and experience to deliver relevant projects
- A subcommittee of the SNB carefully reviews the applications and decides which ones to support given priorities and the limited budget
- MOPAC must approve each project before it can move forward
- For 2018/19 we funded 7 projects for up to £4,500 each
  - Primarily focused on Youth Engagement and Preventing Youth Crime

# 2018/19 Funded Projects 1/4

Entity	Description
Dalgarno Trust	<p><u>Diversionsary Boxing Programme</u></p> <p>Provides young people (both boys &amp; girls) with boxing training (total participants grew from 38 to 60 to now 150 users)</p> <p>Boxing leadership course for 9 individuals</p> <p>Celebratory evening organised by the young people</p>
Baraka Community Association	<p><u>Youth Engagement against Crime</u></p> <p>Targeted Somali, Algerian &amp; Moroccan youths</p> <p>20-35 youths each Friday &amp; Saturday evening</p> <p>Positive activities away from local street crime: drugs &amp; knives</p>

# 2018/19 Funded Projects 2/4

Entity	Description
Growing Against Violence (GAV)	<p><u>Anti-Gang Youth Engagement in Schools</u></p> <p>Interactive workshops aimed at recognising gang issues Sessions run in targeted local schools for Year 6 students Programme was run in 10 schools reaching 480 youths</p>
Advance Charity	<p><u>Preventing Domestic Abuse and Violence Against Women &amp; Girls</u></p> <p>Raising awareness of DA issues with youths and professionals 3 workshops for 25 individuals; fewer than anticipated due to a vacancy in the Independent Domestic Violence Advisor 35-40 young women engaged for longer term support</p>

# 2018/19 Funded Projects 3/4

Entity	Description
YIAG & Met Local SNT	<u>Neighbourhood “Kicks” Youth Engagement</u> Run by local Met Police & Youth Independent Advisory Group Weekly football activities for 25-35+ local youths Able to socialise in a safe environment Creates very positive relationships with local Police Challenges attitudes and prevents being drawn into crime
NWH & SNB	<u>Annual Crime Summit</u> Saturday public meeting held in March with 4-5 presentations Stalls covering various safety and crime aspects for residents to review and discuss in an informal setting; lunch provided

# 2018/19 Funded Projects 4/4

Entity	Description
Kids on the Green	<p><u>Anti-Violence Drama Workshops</u></p> <p>Eight 90-min weekly workshops using drama to focus on typical violent situations and work out alternative actions</p> <p>Very high enthusiasm from participants</p> <p>9 individuals participated in all sessions</p> <p>Ending showcase of skills with presentation to an audience</p>

# Project Funding 2019/20

- For the year 2019/20, MOPAC has indicated:
  - The K&C SNB will receive the same amount as the last 3 years:  
£23,670
  - Spending on any one project limited to £5,000
  - At least £3,000 must be spent on NHW
- The SNB made application to MOPAC in May for 6 projects
- Approval is expected, however, due to administrative issues within MOPAC, they have yet to approve any projects for 2019/20



# SNB Core Function & Priorities (2019 MOPAC Update)

- Enable local engagement and accountability of the Police
- Focus on the key principles and priorities of the MOPAC Police and Crime Plan:
  - putting victims first and reducing inequalities;
  - keeping children and young people safe;
  - tackling violence against women and girls; and
  - tackling hate crime and intolerance
- Monitor crime performance and public perceptions (community confidence)
- Inform the development of policing priorities in the borough
- Monitor MPS delivery of Ward Panels and Community Contact Sessions
- Engage with IAG, NHW and CMG's (S&S and ICV) to support/inform their work
