




7-day case rate per 100,000

Latest Lockdown Guidance

National Lockdown: Stay at Home

You must not leave or be outside of your home except where necessary.

You may only leave the home to:

- Shop for basic necessities, for you or a vulnerable person
- Go to work, or to provide voluntary or charitable services, if you cannot reasonably do so from home
- Exercise with your household (or support bubble) or one other person (keeping 2m apart). Exercise should be limited to once per day, and you should not travel outside your local area.
- Meet your support bubble or childcare bubble where necessary, but only if you are legally permitted to form one.
- Attend education or childcare – for those eligible
- Seek medical assistance
- Escape domestic abuse

You should follow this guidance immediately. **This is the law.**
